RE: Consultation on the Implementation of the Interim Standard on Per- and Polyfluoroalkyl Substances (PFAS) in Municipal Biosolids

The National Cattle Feeders' Association (NCFA) represents Canadian cattle feeders on national issues and works collaboratively with other stakeholders to strengthen the Canadian beef industry. Our members represent a significant volume of manure production and, subsequently, the potential for marketing manure, compost and digestate. As such, we appreciate the opportunity to provide comments for the *Consultation on the Implementation of the Interim Standard on Per- and Polyfuoroalkyl Substances (PFAS) in Municipal Biosolids*.
